## The Key of A

All we need to do now is to pick a musical KEY and learn some of the chords that inhabit the Twelve Bar Blues progression in that key. Let's go with the Key of A. Not only is the Key of A one of the most comfortable keys to play on the mandolin, but it's also a favorite key on the guitar. You'll get a better feeling for what a key is as we go through this section.

See, there are 12 keys in music, each one named after a different note. The A note is the overriding note in the Key of A, making the A chord the boss. But other chords will be sprinkled in, secondarily, to any song that's in the Key of A. But not just any chords. To figure out the other subsidiary chords that "belong" to Key of A:

Lay out the Musical Alphabet, which contains 7 letters ABCDEFG, starting with the Root Note A. These notes are the Do-Re-Mi... sequence from "The Sound Of Music." Pick off the 1st, the 4th and the 5th letters, which thus indicate the 1-4-5 chords in the Key of A:

## So $\boldsymbol{A}, \mathbf{D}$ and $\boldsymbol{E}$ are the 1, 4 and 5 chords in the Key of $\boldsymbol{A}$.

For any key, the $\mathbf{1}$ chord will sound in charge, and predominates. The $\mathbf{4}$ chord will have a supportive, friendly feel, while the $\mathbf{5}$ chord will be pushier, almost at odds with the $\mathbf{1}$ chord.

Another thing: These chords CAN have either (1) a Major or (2) a Seventh chord quality. You'll hear the difference below. Looking at the above diagram again, do NOT worry about the 2, 3, 6, and $\mathbf{7}$ chords in this Chord Family Lineup (they have mostly Minor chord qualities) and do NOT worry (yet) about what that "\#" ("sharp") means.

You can check Mando From Scratch for further analysis. All we care about right now are the 1-4-5 chords in the Key of A. Below are some simple A, D and $\mathbf{E}$ chords that have the Major and Seventh chord qualities. The Index, Middle and Ring fingers are indicated by the numbers $\mathbf{1 , 2}$ and $\mathbf{3}$, and the " $\mathbf{0}$ " indicates a string that rings open.
